• It comes down to datasets speaking the same language, thus Alleviate are working towards a common data model. Though not perfect, it provides a good basis to standardise qualitative and quantitative data where possible. It also helps us think about how we can improve and standardise data collection, develop better data classifications and sense of the content.
